- The CS0-Turbo was for the american market only. "Normal" FI-cars were shipped to the US and upgraded with a turbo charging unit by Legend Industries Inc.
- The identification of the model '80 Spiders is quite hard, because FIAT took sometimes a chassis of a CS2 and marked the car being a CS0 (and vice versa).
- Pininfarina took over the manufacturing for the D-series (DS0,DS1,DS-VX) DS-0 is a pre-series (just a few were built).
- In the US the DS1 was also sold as the Spider Azzura.
